## Index to Art and Design

The Index to Art & Design in Ireland was set-up in 1975 in the Art & Design Library of the then Ulster Polytechnic. Press cuttings are taken from the newspapers to which the library subscribes and this electronic index has been developed by library staff to provide a single, searchable resource to the cuttings collection for those undertaking research into Art & Design in Ireland.

## Slavery and Abolition in the English Newspapers

The campaign to abolish the British slave trade was one of the most important public debates of the late eighteenth century. References to slavery are thus frequently found in newspapers of the period, and are particularly prominent in newspapers published at the height of the campaign in 1787-92.

References to slavery in mid-eighteenth-century English newspapers are not difficult to find, but are generally marginal. Although slavery is mentioned occasionally in news items, most references occur, often obliquely, in advertisements for colonial estates, colonial produce and, very occasionally, for individual slaves. Shipping news yields a great deal of information on the movements of slave traders and their vessels, particularly in the major slave-trading ports of Bristol, Liverpool and London. There are, however, few outright condemnations of the trade before 1770. The first major abolitionist success, which was widely reported in the newspapers, was the Somerset Case of 1771-72 in which Lord Chief Justice Mansfield ruled that no-one in England had a right 'to take a slave by force to be sold abroad' (*State Trials*, XX, cols. 1-82). Many newspapers offered detailed reports of court proceedings alongside analysis of the implications of the ruling and commentary on the performance of the lawyers involved. Thus, for the first time, abolitionist arguments were brought to a mass reading public. Breaches of the ruling were also reported. For example, in late May 1773, several newspapers reported the suicide of a slave taken by force in London to be sold abroad. These reports prompted John Bicknell and Thomas Day to write their poem *The Dying Negro*, which would inspire a generation of abolitionists.

*Stuart's Star and Evening Advertiser*, on 2 April 1789. Perhaps the most significant development is the intensity with which the slavery debate is conducted through readers' letters and through editorial comment - the latter comparatively rare in the eighteenth century. Both proslavery and antislavery arguments are rehearsed in letters, often published side by side, and while most London newspapers attempted impartiality (with varying degrees of success) a marked proslavery bias is discernible in newspapers such as *The Bristol Journal* that were published in slave-trading ports.

EAST NORTHFIELD, Mass., July 9.—The increasing demands for segregation prove that the prejudice against negroes is growing in the North, Mrs. Charlotte Hawkins Brown, international negress leader and a founder of the Palmer Institute of North Carolina, declared in her address before the Northfield Woman's Interdenominational Home Mission Conference here tonight.

"The Emancipation Proclamation did not free the negro woman," Mrs. Brown stated. "It has taken fifty years to remove the stigma attached to the relations she sustained in that system. Notwithstanding her culture and training, the average white woman still thinks of the negro woman in terms of domestic service and assigns to her a place of inferiority in society."



# Example 2: Emigration From Ireland

The British Newspapers 1600 -1900 is another excellent resource for primary material. Below are three examples of extracts over a 10 year period relating to emigration from Ireland. The search strategy was **emigration Ireland**. These terms are highlighted in the extracts

1. Lloyd's Evening Post 30<sup>th</sup> August 1773.

Such has been the **emigration from Ireland** of late, on account of the great decrease of the linen manufacture, &c. that we are informed, by a Gentleman of veracity just arrived from Philadelphia, that in the course of the last year there have been landed there, from only two ports in the North of Ireland, no less than 12,000 families.

The crops of grain in Ireland have been never known more plentiful than they are at present. Wheat is cheaper there than in England.



# Example 2: Emigration From Ireland

2. Morning Herald and Daily Advertiser 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1783

The emigration from Ireland to America threatens a depopulation of our filter kingdom. Arts, manufactures, and tillage have been neglected these four years past for the red coat and the bayonet, infomuch that a famine at this moment rages in the northern part of the kingdom. The repeal of the declaratory act has not lessened the affize of bread, or lowered the price of beer, On the contrary, it has made those two necessaries of life much dearer than they have been in Ireland these twenty years past.



## Example 2: Emigration From Ireland

### 3. Morning Post and Daily Advertiser 15<sup>th</sup> July 1784

The spirit of **emigration** from **Ireland** is as great as ever. The St. Patrick and Faithful Steward sailed last week from Londonderry with *one thousand* passengers, most of them redemptioners, or white slaves!—The Three Brothers also sailed from Belfast a few days ago with *three hundred* passengers.

The answer of the Lord Lieutenant to the aggregate body, shews that there are three parties convulsing Ireland at present. The ministerial—the parliament—and the people. In a word, they are determined to be free—that have affixed certain ideas to the word Freedom, and in their progress towards it, they do not see that they are distracting the peace of the nation, at a time when it is their interest to cultivate the arts of commerce, and to extend their connections.

Note the reference in the second paragraph to a growing separatist attitude in Ireland.

*The Lord Lieutenant at the time was Charles Manners, 4<sup>th</sup> Duke of Rutland.*
